First West Counseling Center - \$178,120 (Year 3)

Project HELP 2011-12 (Healing, Education, Life Skills, Parenting) will provide funds to continue, refine, and expand health care services developed and implemented by Project HELP pilot project established in 2009. These health care services are primarily mental health; it is understood that physical, emotional, environmental, and academic health can heavily influence one's mental health and vice versa. Therefore, the project is designed to address and/or coordinate already established community services for a holistic comprehensive approach- maximizing the outcomes for the dollars spent and of those served.

A family coordinator, previously referred to as a case worker, along with a team of counselors will bring diagnostic, therapeutic, mentoring and educational services to students, parents/care givers and school staffs of three elementary schools and one middle school (the feeder for the elementary schools) **Lenwil Elementary, Riverbend Elementary, Riser Elementary & Riser Middle.**

Seeker Springs - \$29,388 (Year 2)

The Team Up Adolescent Counseling Program will provide easily accessible school based group counseling for students who are at risk of, or experiencing mental health issues as evidenced by behavior problems, behaviors such as sexual acting out or use of drugs, change in academic performance, family struggles, truancy/tardiness, and/or general anxiety or depression. The program will be offered during school hours, on campus, to those who have been referred by their school counselors and whose parents agree to their child's participation.

History

- Riser Clinic opened Jan. 7, 2002 & WMHS Clinic opened Sept. 28, 2007
- Funded by grant from OPH-ASHI in amount of approximately \$130,000 annually
- Sponsor provides a minimum of 20% matching funds (also funded by billing). Sponsor must be nonprofit. OPSB and Living Well Foundation collaborated to sponsor SBHC
- OPSB provides building, maintenance and utilities
- 3 year contract with OPH expires June 30, 2013, renewable upon meeting contract requirements

Services Rendered:

- Acute illness diagnosis & treatment (includes labwork – strep, mono, HGB, Glu, urinalysis, etc.)
- Management of chronic illness
- Comprehensive and sports physicals
- Immunizations
- Vision, Hearing, Diabetes, HTN screenings with referrals
- Mental health counseling
- Dental hygiene clinic (Riser)
